Multiple Myeloma, commonly known as myeloma, is a cancer of the plasma cells. A plasma cell is a type of immune cell that produces antibodies to fight infection. Plasma cells are found in the bone marrow, the "blood factory" located within the hollow area of bones.

This disease can cause numerous complications throughout the body. It is not yet curable, but thanks to recent medical research, it is increasingly treatable.

### **IN-PERSON AND VIRTUAL MEETINGS**

We meet, either virtually using Zoom video conferencing software, or in person every month. We meet in person at Jubilee United Church, at 40 Underhill Drive, near The Don Valley Parkway and Lawrence Ave. East. Some meetings include a presentation by an expert in the field of myeloma or a related topic.
